American Alligator Alligator mississippiensis

Fun Fact:

American alligators are less active in the winter months. They enter brumation, where their activity slows down. But they may emerge from their burrows to bask on sunny, warm days.





Grizzly Bear Ursus arctos horribilis

Fun Fact:

During the winter season grizzly bears find a den and enter hibernation, a form of extended torpor. They can stay in their dens for up to seven months, but if there is food available, they may be active.

Fun Fact:

Moose are the largest members

of the deer family, standing six feet

tall from hoof to shoulder. They stay


active in the winter, and are able to

move through deep snow, and

Fun Fact:

North American river otters communicate with whistles, yelps, growls, and screams, as well as touch and body posture. They remain active in the winter, and stay warm in cold waters due to their thick, protective fur.
