#### What is an endangered species?

Endangered species are plants and animals at risk of becoming extinct due to various threats such as habitat loss, pollution, climate change, and human exploitation. Protecting endangered species is crucial for preserving biodiversity and maintaining balanced ecosystems.

Status: Critically Endangered, IUCN Red List



#### Bald eagles have an impressive wingspan of up to 6.5 feet!


**Status:** Delisted. The bald eagle was previously listed under the Endangered Species Act but was delisted in 2007 due to recovery efforts.

**Status: Endangered,** IUCN Red List




#### **Leatherback Sea Turtle**


The Endangered Species Act: Protecting at-risk plants and animals since 1973.

The Monarch Butterfly travels from the U.S. to Mexico every year!


Status: Proposed Threatened, USFWS December 2024.





### **Northern Long-eared Bat**


The Northern Long-eared Bat has long ears that can reach past its nose!

**Status: Endangered, USFWS** 




### **Scalloped Hammerhead Shark**

**Status: Critically Endangered, IUCN Red List** 






#### **Snow Leopard**

# **Facts About Endangered Species**

- There are over 1,300 endangered or threatened species in the U.S.
- A wildlife species can be listed as endangered at the state, federal, and international level. A species classified as threatened or endangered indicates a significant risk to its survival.
- At the U.S. federal level, endangered and threatened species are protected by the Endangered Species Act (ESA) (https://www.epa.gov/laws-regulations/summary-endangered-species-act). Their protections are enforced by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) (https://ecos.fws.gov/ecp/), or the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) (https://www.fisheries.noaa.gov/) for certain marine species.
- The International Union for Conservation of Nature's (IUCN) (https://www.iucnredlist.org/)
  Red List provides conservation status assessments for species worldwide.
